

Residency/Fellowship SIG Meeting - CSM 2010

The update of the initial year indicates there are 13 credential residencies and 1 fellowship. New residencies include St. Francis University , University of Mississippi Medical Center and Hospital for Special Surgery. Duke University Medical Center fellowship was re-credentialed.

Educational goals include Residency 101 lead by Theresa Schuemann at Team Concepts Conference 12/2010 and a Residence Case Conference at CSM 2012. Chuck Thigpen is to discuss development of the latter with Tim Sell and Barb Hoogenboom and John DeWitt will talk to Programs Service Council.

Curriculum development was discussion including coordination with the sub-committee for sports residency curriculum and use of the model established by the Orthopaedic Section.

The requirement of being a Red Cross Emergency Responder , EMT , or ATC was brought to the floor by the University of Delaware . It was suggested this be removed as a requirement to apply for or begin residency. A vote will be made via email by 3/31/10 .

Event coverage required for residency discussed essential components including collision sports or an equivalent. Guidelines need to be established. Additionally, there needs to be clarification of the 200 hours of event coverage. It was questioned if non-mentored event coverage counts.

Craig Garrison expressed interest in assuming the role of Secretary.
